

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion—with high delight—"we proclaim the Lord's death."

A: God shows favor to us, leading us like a flock, sending us the Son to be the one of peace.


C: Love shines, a light in the darkness.

As the candles are lit, we sing:





WORD

THE FIRST READING: MICAH 5:2-5a

The prophet Micah, having pronounced judgment upon Judah, speaks of a future shepherd-king who, like David, will come from the small town of Bethlehem. (Ephrathah refers to the area around Bethlehem.) This king will restore Israel and bring peace. New Testament writers understood this passage to be referring to Jesus.

²But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. ³Therefore they shall be given up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of the ruler's kindred shall return to the people of Israel. ⁴And the ruler shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his

God. And they shall live secure, for now the ruler shall be great to the ends of the earth, ^{5a} and he shall be the one of peace.

SECOND READING: HEBREWS 10:5-10

The author of Hebrews uses the image of religious sacrifice to convey the significance of Christ's coming. Through obedient acceptance of God's will, Christ allows his own body to become the greatest sacrifice of all, one through which we are made a holy people.

⁵Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; ⁶in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. ⁷Then I said, 'See, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." ⁸When Christ said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." Christ abolishes the


first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴²and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."






COMMUNION

WEEKLY THEME Advent 4: Quicken Quickly

In 1976, three young children died on a suburban street outside of Belfast. They were innocent casualties in violence that was sweeping Northern Ireland as the terrorist paramilitary IRA attempted to drive out the British. In the wake of the tragedy, three ordinary people, Betty Williams, Mairead Corrigan, and Ciaran McKeown, founded the Peace People movement. They organized marches and rallies to highlight the truth that violence cannot bring social justice.

We are often quick to conflict and misunderstanding. We are quick to speak but not to listen. But God's desire for all of humanity has always been peace, often working through ordinary people in ordinary places to wage it. God looks to Bethlehem, not Jerusalem, for a shepherd ruler. God comes to Mary to bear the Christ child. God anoints Elizabeth with the Holy Spirit, her child quickening within her to herald the good news that God's promises are coming to fruition.

God quickens peace among us. God draws us into community to work for peace. Together in faith we build a shared joy and expectation of what will be born in us, what will come to life in the love we share with each other. God's action and our action quickly combine and we see the truth of how peace is born through love: the proud are scattered, the mighty are cast down and the lowly lifted, the rich are emptied while the hungry are filled, and mercy becomes the way.
