"The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched [Elijah], and said, Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." --2 Kings 19:7

Preparing for a journey means planning for enough fuel to carry you through—this includes calories for your physical body! When our high school youth group prepared to travel to New Orleans for the ELCA Youth Gathering in late July, we planned a daily amount of money to spend on food.

Sometimes we ate cheaper food, burgers or sandwiches, so we could save the money we budgeted for the day. A few times we decided to spend a little more money on a sit-down restaurant, so we could experience the local food culture. We got to sample some Cajun dining staples like gumbo, jambalaya, red beans and rice, etouffee and grits, muffulettas, and po-boys. We also got New Orleans specialties like fried pickles, and of course beignets from Café du Monde (we were all sprinkled with magical beignet dust: powdered sugar). The brave ones among us tried foods as exotic as crawfish and alligator!

All of the food we ate gave us energy so our bodies could keep going, walking many, many miles throughout the city for days on end. But these memorable meals of cultural culinary treasures—these fed our spirits and our imaginations, as the whole Gathering experience fed our souls as well. God feeds us in all of these ways!

On our last evening in New Orleans, we wanted to try one more recommended spot: Mother's Restaurant on Poydras Street, famous for their Cajun food and especially po-boy sandwiches. As we waited in the line that had already formed outside the building, our adult leader Gretchen saw an unfamiliar word on the menu—sandwiches served with "debris." Since "debris" usually means "garbage," Gretchen asked one of the servers what this meant. The woman server didn't answer Gretchen's question, but instead said, "Wait right here." So we continued wondering and waiting.

Moments later, the woman server popped her head out the door and handed Gretchen a small, steaming hot plastic take-out container. "Here. This is debris," she said. Gretchen was surprised, opening the lid to reveal fragrant savory shredded beef in au jus. The woman smiled, "Well, this is what you asked for!" Gretchen just said, "I love you!"

And I think the reign of God is like this: when there are no words to describe the wonders, you just have to smell and taste and experience it for yourself.

You can make it through this journey of faith! God will not fail to feed you and prepare you for every step of the way.

Finance Report for June 2024

This is the June 2024 financial report. As you know, the congregation voted to approve a budget for 2024 that had a projected deficit of \$39,870. We estimated based on pledges and previous year giving that we would receive \$295,595 income with \$335,465 of expenses. Using the previous three years of data, we determined what percentage of our total income we get each month and use that to estimate about how much income we will receive. By the end of June we usually receive about 47% of our income. Based on this estimate, at this point in time, we expect to receive about \$323,149, which is \$27,554 more than we estimated. Good news! However, we estimate we will fall short by \$12,300 against expected expenses. This is better than last month, so good work everyone! But we still have a challenge. Our expenses are very close to the budget we approved. If you would like more details, the financial reports are posted on the council bulletin board in the hall way outside of sanctuary. If you would like to talk with someone, I am available to answer most of your questions. For the Council, Rick Schuessler, Secretary.

The practitioners will showcase sound healing and breathwork techniques. If you'd like to volunteer to help over the two days please reach out to Aria Thomé after service. We welcome all voices, ideas and skills to the Project Sanctuary team that meets monthly, typically on Monday nights. If you are interested in sharing your talents, please join us!

What is Project Sanctuary? Project Sanctuary is a monthly breathwork and sound healing event hosted by trauma-informed practitioners for those marginalized communities who have experienced rejection by organized religion. The goal is to show these communities they are loved, accepted and worthy of God's full redeeming grace. Sessions are held in Gethsemane's sanctuary space. Facilitated by Aria Thomé and other trained practitioners.

Why is support needed? Project Sanctuary strives to offer the sessions at low to no cost to attendees. A grant from the *Lutheran Foundation* that provided the seed money for PS and helped cover costs is near depletion. As we find ways to continue supporting this mission, we ask for your support financially and by spreading the word about PS. Please consider a PS specific donation as part of your Sunday offering. 
