In mid-July, I'll be traveling with 15,000 other youth to New Orleans, Louisiana for the ELCA Youth Gathering. I bet you're jealous already!

For real. Living in St. Louis has probably prepared our group pretty well for the heat and humidity we'll encounter in New Orleans, and we know there's a schedule though we don't have all the details yet. This journey will be an adventure in faith-building. None of these youth have experienced an ELCA Youth Gathering before.

Some of us older folks have experienced a youth gathering. I went to New Orleans as a high school student, too, and I'll never forget the experience of worshipping with thousands of other Lutherans—staggering for a girl from East Texas who frequently had to explain my faith practices like infant baptism and confirmation classes to my Southern Baptist classmates (and provide convincing evidence that Lutherans are Christian and not a cult).

In the evening Mass Gatherings, we came from all over the United States with a common purpose to learn, celebrate and live out our faith in God with our unique Lutheran accent. This kind of thing doesn't happen every day, and it's worth it to invest years of planning and energy for fundraising and taking time from a busy summer—all to make time for God, to make space in one's life for God to work.

Because God will be working, in us and among us. The theme this year is "Created to Be," with a focus on exploring identity and discipleship, how God creates us as unique individuals, calls us to discern our gifts and our joy for serving, and loves us into becoming who we are created to be.

I can't wait to witness young people experiencing worship on such a large scale, trying new ways to serve, and even encountering the challenges of loving one another while tired and cranky. While meeting with the group of youth from the St. Louis area who will travel together by bus in a few weeks, we discussed bus etiquette, including the consequences of leaving a mess for someone else (cleaning fees will be assessed, for one thing), how to attend to personal hygiene (yes to showers and deodorant; no to body sprays), and using the bus's toilet (only for emergencies).

It made me wonder how Jesus and his disciples negotiated these kinds of care practices necessary for human bodies. Did they have to discuss when to take bathroom breaks while traveling? Who carried their stuff? Who packed the snacks? We don't know a lot of stories about these details.

What we know from Scripture is that the disciples were humans they traveled with Jesus, also a human, and somehow they made it work. Experience tells me that traveling with Jesus will help the rest of us make it work, too.

These awkward, vulnerable spaces are where the Holy Spirit loves to play, creating community as she goes. Pray for all of us on this holy pilgrimage! And may God bless your travels this summer as well!

Finance Report for May 2024

Starting this month, the church council decided to use the monthly newsletter to update the congregation on the financial state of the congregation. As you know the congregation voted to approve a budget for 2024 that had a projected deficit of \$39,870. We estimated based on pledges and previous year giving that we would receive \$295,595 income with \$335,465 of expenses. Using the previous three years of data we determined what percentage of our total income we get each month and use that to estimate about how much income we will receive. As of the end of May we usually receive about 39% of our income. Based on this estimate, at this point in time, we expect to receive about \$316,827, which is \$21,232 more than we estimated. Good news. However, we will fall short by \$18,668 against expected expenses. So, we have challenge. Our expenses are very close to the budget we approved. If you would like more details, the financial reports are posted on the council bulletin board in the hallway outside of sanctuary. If you would like to talk with someone, I am available to answer most of your questions.
