Pastor's Page

"Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."
--Jesus (Mark 3:35)

Summer is often the season for family reunions—maybe you will get together with your kinfolk sometime soon. It's a treasure to visit with family members and hear the stories of your ancestors, look at old photographs, or visit the significant places. Something about these ancestors tells you something about who you are, which is precious. But there's a limiting factor with families: determining who is in or out or who's a blood relative and who "just married in to the family."

Jesus really messes with our understanding of family when he says things like "Where are my mother and brothers?"...while in the presence of his mother and siblings. How disrespectful! Does Jesus care nothing about Christian family values?!

It's almost like Jesus wants to blow apart our concept of family. It's almost like lineage and inheritances and family traditions are not meaningful to him. It's almost like he wants us to notice our connections by way of baptism rather than biological connections through blood or DNA. It's almost like the reign of God values humans—and human families—in a whole different way.

I think this is why I started questioning why we make such a big deal out of Mother's Day and Father's Day, when parenthood is so complicated a task and even more complicated as an identity. How can we celebrate parents without reinforcing gender roles in unhelpful ways? This year, I shifted the focus of the blessings we say as part of worship, considering some of the tasks represented by parenting but without the gendered language.

On the day acknowledged as Mother's Day, I crafted a prayer of gratitude for our ancestors—looking back in time at the people who raised us (or the people who are currently raising us), including parents, grandparents, ancestors we never met, as well as all those other leaders like teachers and coaches and mentors who have shaped us to become who we are. We should care about where we come from.

On the day our culture celebrates as Father's Day, our prayer of gratitude will be for all those people who care for children, who look out for the needs of the youngest ones among us, including parents of course, but also day care workers and camp staff and citizens who pay property taxes that fund schools and others who advocate for children's rights. We should care about the future and who will come after us.

How do these blessings and celebrations sound to you? How do you celebrate your own family of origin? How do you celebrate the family that God creates among us in baptism?

The simple fact is that we truly need each other, created by God in our uniqueness and called by God to live our vocations faithfully! Brother, sister, sibling in Christ—the Holy Spirit makes us one. Thanks be to God!


